Timothy McCullouch given 20-year sentence in sex-trafficking case

EL PASO, Texas – Former El Paso County Juvenile Probation Office and former UTEP football player Timothy Keith McCullouch Jr. was sentenced to 18 years in prison for his involvement in a sex-trafficking ring.

McCullouch was found guilty in January of conspiracy to commit sex trafficking of persons, federal officials said.

Between May 2012 and March 2013, McCullouch along with Richard Gray, 25; Deion Lockhart, 26; and Emmanuel Lockhart, 24, were involved in the forced prostitution of juveniles and adults by the Folk Nation/Gangster Disciples street gang.

Officials said they used force, fraud and coercion to get their victims to perform sex acts for money in El Paso, Killeen, Albuquerque, Las Vegas and Colorado.

Last week, a judge sentenced Emmanuel Lockhart to 20 years in prison, Deion Lockhart to 25 years in prison and Richard Gray a life sentence for his involvement.
