PLEASE NOTE: THE PURPOSE OF COMPARING THE DATA AND STATISTICS CITED ON THESE SPREADSHEETS IS THAT WE NOTE THAT BJS STATISTICS VARY FROM TABLE TO TABLE, AND SOMETIMES THE DIFFERENCE IS SUBSTANTIAL, WHILE OTHER TIMES IT SEEMS TO SIMPLY BE A ROUNDING OFF OF THE NUMBERS. ALSO, WHEN THE TABLES AND REPORTS FOR THE NEW YEAR ARE PUBLISHED ON THE FBI BUREAU OF JUSTICE STATISTICS WEBSITE, THEY FREQUENTLY CONTAIN WHAT APPEAR TO BE UPDATED NUMBERS FOR PREVIOUS YEARS WITH NO EXPLANATION OF WHY OR HOW THE NUMBERS CITED HAVE INCREASED OR DECREASED FROM THEIR PAST REPORTS. THERE SEEMS TO BE NO CONSISTENCY IN HOW THE NUMBERS ARE REPORTED, NO EXPLANATION WHY THEY DIFFER SUBSTANTIALLY IN MANY CASES OR WHAT THE MOST CURRENT, UP TO DATE OR MOST ACCURATE STATISTICS ARE. PLEASE REMEMBER THAT WE ARE ONLY PRESENTING THE STATISTICS AS PROVIDED ON THE ORIGINAL TABLES BY THE FBI BJS AND THAT ANY INCONSISTENCY IN THESE DOCUMENTS IS THEIRS, NOT OURS.
