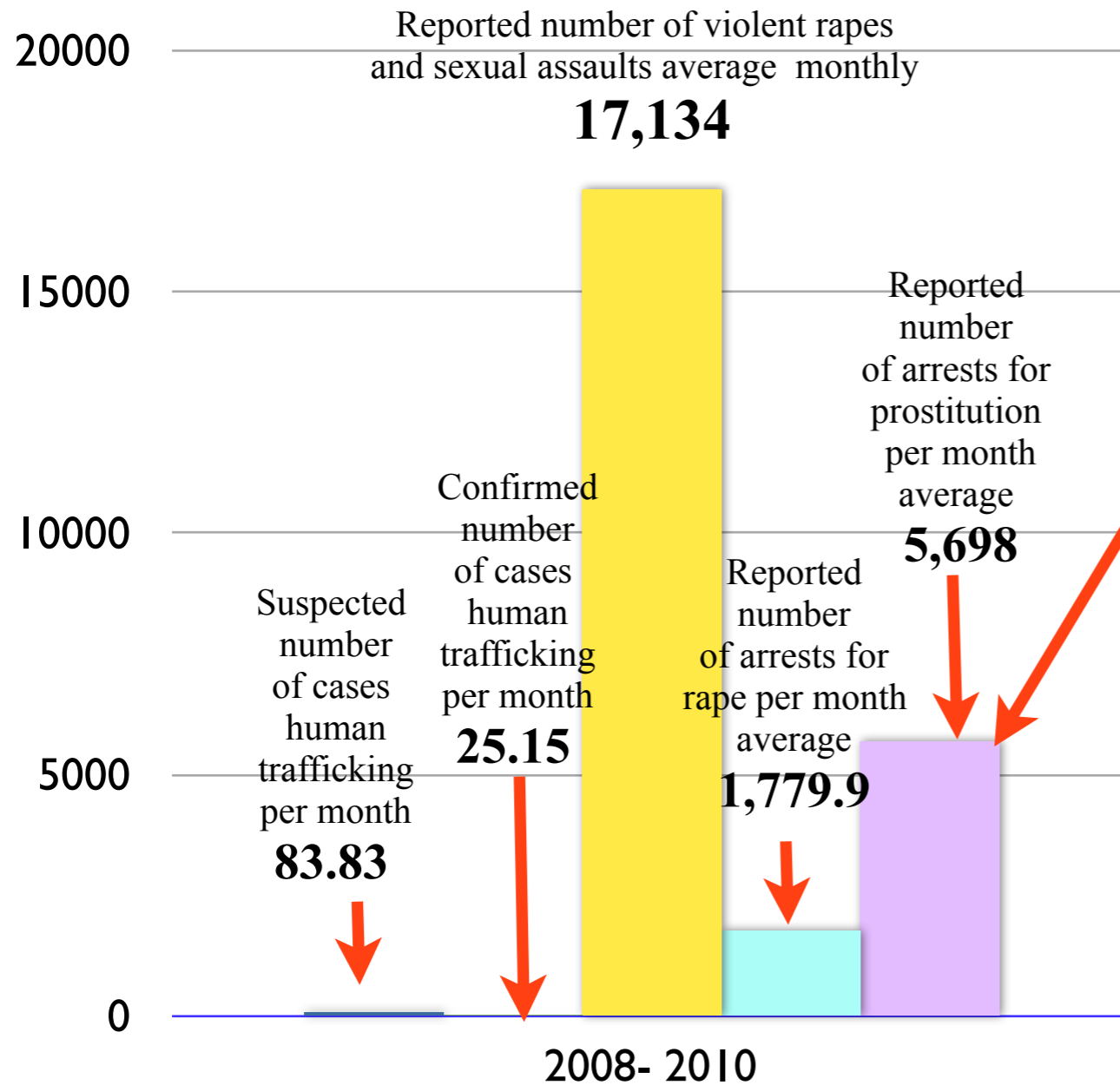


2008- 2010 Average Monthly Number of Reported Rape Victims, Rape Arrests, Prostitution Arrests vs. Suspected Incidents of Human Trafficking



$5,698 \times \$3,805.03 = \$ 21,680,890$ average spent per month [based on the 1987 estimate \$2,000 cost per arrest for prostitution adjusted for inflation in 2009]

Annual cost of prostitution arrests estimate:
\$260,170,680

If the government really believed that human trafficking was as significant a problem as they claim, *why would they continue to arrest consenting adults engaging in commercial sex rather than use that money to find and assist those human trafficking victims?*

Monthly average stats based on the following annual statistics reported:

Human Trafficking	1,006 yearly suspected human trafficking cases ($2515 / 30 \text{ mo.} = \mathbf{83.83 \text{ mo}} \times 12$)
Confirmed Human Trafficking	301 yearly confirmed cases ($@30\% \text{ of } 2,515 = /30 \text{ mo} = \mathbf{25.15 \text{ mo}} \times 12 = \mathbf{301}$)
Reported Rapes/ Sexual Assaults	514,021 reported rapes sexual assaults ($514,021 / 30 \text{ mo} = \mathbf{17,134}$ per month)
Arrests for Rape	21,359 average annual arrests for rape ($21,359 / 12 = \mathbf{1,779}$ mo)
Arrests for Prostitution	68,386 average annual adult prostitution arrests ($68,386 / 12 = \mathbf{5,698}$ per mo)
