

## College women and rape;

- In 2006, an estimated 673,000 (11.5 percent) of nearly six million women attending American colleges were raped, and 12 percent of rapes of college women were reported to law enforcement.<sup>4</sup>

In 2006, there were an estimated **673,000 college women raped.**

The number of college women who were raped is an estimate- and like the ‘guesstimates’ for the number of sex trafficking victims, may be highly over-inflated (usually for political reason\$).

Nevertheless, even if the number IS merely a guesstimate and not an accurate count, the estimate is still far greater than the guesstimate of alleged sex trafficking victims. As noted on previous pages, guesstimates of sex trafficking victims range from 100,000 to 300,000 per year (see the Polaris Project and CNN estimates)

The ‘estimated’ number of rapes among college women is over twice as many ‘guesstimated’ sex trafficking victims. And if the reported number of college women rape victims comes close to the estimates, the number of raped college women is far more significant than the ‘reported’ cases of sex trafficking victims. It would seem that being a college student is at least AS dangerous for women as prostitution abolitionists claim that being a prostitute is for sex workers.
