When the incidents of **REPORTED** crimes of rape and domestic violence FAR exceed the number of **FBI confirmed cases** of adult and child **sex trafficking**, and even cases of child sexual abuse at the hands of **cops, teachers and clergy seriously** outnumber those confirmed sex trafficking cases- what are we to think of those who insist that arresting consenting adults engaged in commercial sex is MORE important than spending scarce police resources pursuing the greater number of predators? Or that the eradication of ALL sex work will somehow solve the problems of sexual exploitation that women and children face?

#### AN EPIDEMIC OF DISBELIEF

Across the country, as many as 200,000 rape kits sit unopened in police storage while assailants—the people whose genetic fingerprints are decisively coded within such kits—are able to dodge prosecution and, in some cases, strike again. When kits go untested, sexual predators can flourish. In one Detroit case, an assailant struck 11 times over 11 years, all while his DNA sat with police. And it took a serial killer, one who had been previously convicted of rape, for Cleveland's police department to begin testing its backlog. (Officers even tested the kit of a victim who managed to escape, but not for DNA evidence: Instead, they checked for drugs in her system.)

Domestic violence is like no other crime. It does not happen in a vacuum. It does not happen because someone is in the wrong place at the wrong time. Homes and families are supposed to be sacred territory, the "haven in a heartless world," as my college sociology teacher drilled into me. This is part of what makes the violence so untenable. It's violence from someone you know, from someone who claims to love you. It is most often hidden from even one's closest confidantes, and on many occasions the physical violence is far less damaging than the emotional and verbal violence.

If women are to be believed when we say we ARE a victim of abuse- WHY aren't we believed when we tell you WE ARE NOT A VICTIM?
